

Any transfer student violating any District policy shall be subject to appropriate disciplinary procedures, and after due examination by District administrative authorities may have the transfer revoked.

Reasons for removal from school and revocation of the transfer shall include but not be limited to the following:

1. The student is charged in any court with any felony or misdemeanor offense involving drugs or narcotics and a conviction results from such charges.
2. The student is indicted by a grand jury on a felony charge and found guilty.
3. The student is declared by the courts to be a juvenile delinquent because of a drug or narcotics charge or conviction.
4. The student possesses or uses any drug or narcotic considered to be dangerous while on school premises at any time, whether in the classroom, at an athletic event, or at any other event held on school premises or any school-sponsored activity.
5. The student uses tobacco and/or alcoholic drinks on school premises or at any school-sponsored activity.
6. The student is unable or unwilling to confirm to the school situation and his or her attitude and conduct are such that the student's presence in school is detrimental to the school program.
7. The student is a party to any interruption of school, disturbance of classes, or any disobedience.
8. The student fails to attend school regularly and/or is habitually truant.
9. For any reason for which the administration believes the continued attendance of the transfer student is sufficiently detrimental to other students and to the welfare of the total District.

Transfer students who become discipline problems shall have their transfer agreements revoked; written notification of the transfer revocation shall be sent to the school district of residence.
